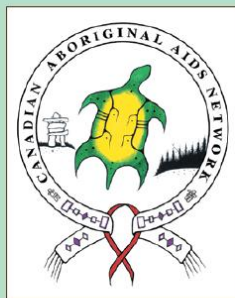

2003:

- Notable increase in HIV & AIDS research
- Few opportunities for dissemination of research results
- CAAN applied for funding for a dissemination project

2006: Inaugural edition of CJACBR published!

- Highlights Aboriginal researchers who are engaged in Community-based HIV & AIDS research

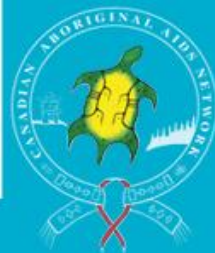

Peer Review Board

- Individuals who are engaged in research at both the community and academic level;
- Strive for inclusivity on our Review Board

Publication Process

- Call for papers
- CAAN Editors review papers
- Papers are ‘blinded’ and sent to Reviewers
- Reviewers send comments to CAAN
- Comments are summarized
- Conference call for final decision on papers
- Letter sent to authors
- Materials are revised

CAAN



Criteria for papers

- Demonstrate the implementation of OCAP principles;
- Provide strong evidence for its conclusions;
- Introduce new information;
- Important and relevant to the Aboriginal HIV & AIDS movement in Canada; and
- Ideally, interesting and applicable to the broad audience of the CJACBR and researchers in other disciplines.

- Dissemination of Results / Findings
- Commentary
- Emerging Issues in Aboriginal Community-based HIV & AIDS Research (ACBR)
- Ownership, Control, Access, and Possession (OCAP) and Ethics
- International work that includes an Aboriginal Canadian component
- Stories
- Student work

Publication Agreement

- CJACBR: exclusive license to publish
- CJACBR & authors – shared copyright
- OCAP & CJACBR: wider dissemination by author 3 months publication in CJACBR
